Real Results For Pickering-Uxbridge





The Canada Child Benefit

Since 2016, the Canada Child Benefit (CCB) has benefitted nearly 18,000 children in Pickering-Uxbridge by providing parents with tax-free payments of \$550 on average, each month. This means \$6 million a month is helping families in Pickering-Uxbridge.



New Horizons for Seniors Program

The New Horizons for Seniors program provides funding for local organizations to host events and help seniors stay engaged in their community. So far, \$218,965 has been directly invested in Pickering-Uxbridge for this program.



Infrastructure and Public **Transportation**

We've invested over \$94 million to improve Durham Region Transit and increased direct infrastructure transfers into our community to combat Doug Ford's damaging cuts to public services.



Investments in Affordable Housing

We have taken significant steps to ensure every Canadian has a place to call home. Since 2016, we have invested over \$78 million to build and repair 2,535 housing units in Durham Region.



Canada Summer Jobs Program

Through the Canada Summer Jobs program, our government has funded the creation of 1,436 jobs for youth in Pickering-Uxbridge. These positions help students gain the work experience and skills they need to build a successful career.



Internet and Broadband

In our rapidly growing economy, access to fast and reliable internet is more important than ever, especially here in Pickering and Uxbridge. That's why our government is committed to ensuring that by 2021, 90% of Canadians have access to reliable high-speed internet, and 100% of the population by 2030.



The Middle-Class Tax Cut

After Canadians elected our government in 2015, the first thing we did was lower taxes for the middle-class and raise them on the wealthiest 1%. In Pickering-Uxbridge, this meant lower taxes for 30,180 residents. When included with the CCB, this puts \$2,000 more in the pockets of a typical middle-class family.



Helping Canadian Students

To combat Doug Ford's reckless cuts to OSAP, we've worked on making postsecondary education more affordable for students. We've lowered the interest rate on student loans, introduced an interest-free six month grace period and increased Canada Student Grant amounts by 50%.

A More Secure Retirement

Our government has enhanced the Canada Pension Plan by putting 50% more money into the pockets of future retirees. This is up to \$7,000 more per year. We also increased the GIS by up to almost \$1,000 annually for the most vulnerable seniors in Canada.







Protecting our Environment

Since 2015, our government has taken strong action to protect our environment and fight climate change. This includes phasing out coal, putting a price on pollution and returning revenues to Canadians through the Climate Action Incentive, and making greater investments in green technology.



Affordable Prescription Drugs

Canadians shouldn't have to choose between groceries and the prescription drugs they need. Our government has begun implementing a national pharmacare system.

Since being elected as the Member of Parliament for Pickering-Uxbridge in 2015, I've regularly attended numerous events in our riding and have continued to advocate for our community.



When residents in our riding were unable to attend an event at the Claremont Legion due to inaccessibility, our government contributed \$36,000 through the Enabling Accessibility Fund to help build an exterior ramp and indoor lift.



The Pickering Library's Maker Space provides opportunities for people to learn how to code and use 3D printing technologies. Earlier this year, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau saw firsthand how this is helping our community.



Pickering is where I've had the privilege of growing up, and where I am proud to live today.
